4. Students in CMBS

1. Diploma of Theology 2019-2020

For the new academic year, Oct 2019 (Year 1), we had 4 applicants – all of whom passed their interview. Two of them are from MCC and two from independent churches.

- a. First year students: Sok Luka, Wu Ming, Siv Chanmakara and Chea Seanglav.
- b. Second year students: Meas Sreymorn and Thoem Chhuy. (one student from an independent church)
- c. Third year students: Sanh Kimsiem, Threa Vibal, Sinoeun Vannak, Khoun Sreysin,
 On Sreyleang, Sem Sreymao, Ourn Hat and Meas Sreykeo. (4 students from independent churches)
- d. Part-time students: Morn Pov, Thoun Chantol, Sot Sokchear, Keo Ra, Moeun Da, Soem Kalyan.

2. Certificate of Ministry at Banteaymeanchey

The Certificate of Ministry program at Banteaymeanchey is still in progress and has 18 students. The course will be completed end of November 2020. The students will prepare for graduation.

3. BTH/BD:

In this academic year 2019-2020, no student applied to study in the BTh/BD course. Moreover, the students who graduated from the Diploma course did not obtain the required GPA to qualify for the BTh/BD course. We have some part-time students waiting to finish the course, namely, Yorn Thearin, Sok Mathay, Prak Vuthy and Lun Sokhoum.

5. School Activities

- a. In this academic year, we interviewed the new students on 3 4 October 2019 and the school started on 14 October 2019. The first semester ended in late February and the second semester started on 2 March 2019.
- b. All our students were placed in family groups which were led by lecturer-mentors, and in small groups led by student-leaders where they were mentored and guided in discipleship.
- c. All our students were encouraged to mentor and pray for one another, to build one another up spiritually and to share their experiences especially in the weekend ministry.
- d. All the students went for their weekend ministry on Saturday and came back to school on Monday morning to study.
- e. We conducted Holy Communion on the first Tuesday of every month for all students, staff and lecturers.
- f. All the students attended the MCC pray meeting with all the pastors on 25-29 November 2019 at Wesley Methodist Church in Phnom Penh.
- g. Every Tuesday from 6:30pm to 8pm all students and dean of student met together to listen to each other about their weekend ministry, and pray to encourage each other to move on. On Thursday from 6:30pm to 8pm, all the students learned how to pray and lead worship with the Koreans.
- h. Bae Kwang Methodist Church in Korea gives laptops to third year students every year. On 24th November 2019, Rev Lee Hak Sung gave a laptop to each of the 8 third year students and one to the Dean of Studies.
- i. All the students, staff and lecturers celebrated Thanksgiving on 8 November 2019 and Christmas on 19th December 2019.
- j. The school's Christmas break was from 21 to 29 December 2019.
- k. Praise to the Lord, on 4-5 November 2019, the school held an Alumni Fellowship Day. The topic was 'Communication and Relationship'. The Alumni Committee invited Dr Daniel Koh Kah Soon to speak and they chose a new alumni committee to take over the old committee.
- 1. We paid the ATESEA membership fees for 2019.
- m. The School took five of our students to the hospital to donate blood in November 2019.
- n. A 2nd Year student, Sreymorn, had an ear problem both her eardrums were perforated and infected. Therefore, she had an ear surgery on March 3rd and now she is recovering.
- o. The school went on an outing to Kong Kang, Koh Kong, on Sat 22 Feb. All students, staff and teachers had a wonderful time.
- p. On the 2nd of March 2020, our second semester started. But because of Covid 19, the government closed all the schools, businesses and churches in Cambodia on 11th March, 2020. For this period, the school was asked to close till further notice. The management team allowed the staff to stop working for one month with full salary from 19th March to 20th April 2020.
- q. On 22 June 2020, the school management asked Rev Sok Sovandy to talk with the Songkat Chief to ask for permission bring the Year Two and Year Three students back to the school. They would study in person with the lecturers who stay on campus and study online with the lecturers from outside, to complete their scheduled subjects for the year. During this period, the Year One students would continue to study online from home.
- r. On 1st August 2020, we decide to bring the Year One students back to school to complete their scheduled subjects for the year
- s. On 11th August 2020, we brought four third year students (Methodist students) for an interview with the BOM. Praise the Lord, all passed the interview.
- t. The Certificate of Ministry students at Banteay Meanchhey will hopefully graduate in December 2020.

- u. This year, our translator translated a book titled 'Embracing Grace' by Dr G. Howard Mellor.
- v. Year Three students will complete their scheduled subjects on 28th August and meet with the management team on 31st August to get their results.

6. Thanks to the Churches and Agencies

We want to thank God, our partnering churches and all the agencies for providing lecturers and funds to support our students, as well as providing other resources that help us to fulfill God's mission. We also want to thank Siyon Methodist Church (Pastor Ben Im) for donating 50kg of rice to CMBS, Savior Methodist Church (Pastor Koy Toho) for donating 100kg of rice to CMBS, Houreb Methodist church (Rev Ham San) for donating \$10 and Connexio for donating \$5,000 every year to CMBS' General Fund as well as contributing an extra \$4,800 for staff salaries for July and August 2020. We thank Wesley Methodist Church (from Sibu, Sarawak, Malaysia) for donating \$3,500 to the General Fund on June 2020. Our thanks also go to Mr Ju Geon Jong and Mrs Kim Hee Gyeon from Korea who made a contribution of USD17, 373 to our General Fund.

7. CMBS Fellowship and Interaction with all Agencies and President of MCC

The objectives of the fellowship and interaction are:

- a. To gather ideas from MCC and partner agencies for the improvement of the ministry of CMBS.
- b. To discuss the difficult financial situation of CMBS.

8. Postponement of our Graduation and Anniversary Celebration

Starting in March 2020, due to the Covid 19 crisis, the government had closed all schools and banned big social gatherings. For this reason, the management team decided to propose to the Board to:

- a. Postpone Year 3 graduation to next year 2021.
- b. Postpone CMBS 20th Anniversary celebration to 2025.
